During the process of assessing, any questions or concerns can be resolved with the ACS staff team (in relation to any precedents or non-modality-specific requirements), the two ACS Directors/Trustees nominated by IPEM to represent the modality (if of a modality-specific nature) and other members of the Board. As the nominating constituent member professional body, IPEM also provide support to the nominated assessors.
