Many NHS trusts have made great progress towards reducing their environmental impact. Why not share the below ideas of what has been achieved with your employer, to encourage more sustainable practices?

- Installation of cup-less water stations
- Lease/purchase of electric vehicles for business use across the organisation
- Installation of electric car chargers
- Carrying out energy reviews of buildings to obtain recommendations for improvements/upgrades
- Using green energy suppliers for all trust electricity
- Provision of recycling bins at all catering outlets and public area
- The removal of plastic cutlery and containers in the canteen
- Adoption of biodegradable take away food packaging
- Making vegan meals available in the canteen
- Improved cycling facilities e.g. secure bike sheds, showers etc.
- Adding Environmental sustainability added to the trust training program
